

The Great Date Debate

In Lessons of Christmas (Xulon Press), Daniel Armah notes that ancient scholars expressed more than 130 opinions about Jesus' actual birthdate, covering every month of the year. "Even with a debatable date," he concludes, "the blessing of Christmas is obvious."

Likewise. Christmas celebrations aren't diminished by the possible timing of Jesus' birthday with secular festivals. "If December 25th was chosen to rival other pagan worship activities ... for want of a real date," Armah writes, "then that decision has been successful. Indeed those ancient pagan festivals have all been swallowed up, and Christianity has been growing since."





Free Nesting No Longer

For many years various birds including pigeons and sparrows (not necessarily Methodists) have accumulated twigs and grasses in the arched areas of the Spring Street entrance to the church. These open areas offered a perfect and safe nesting place for their families. But while the birds were friendly, they often dropped bits and pieces from their free housing as well as feathers, eggs and newborns. Screening was installed at intervals to prevent new nests from being built. But the clever birds found a way into the corners and once again, avoided rent for their families.

This past summer, the Trustees contracted with Noel Swords to clean and repaint the entire arched entrance along with the staircase. Once this work was completed, George Grassman, a Trustee with carpentry skills, volunteered to seal the spaces long used by the birds. His creative solution has blended in with the architectural aspects of our beautiful church so that those

This was a grass roots effort spearheaded by some active ladies, namely Jane Collins, Miriam Dudek, Ruby Swenk and Sandra Swenk whose ultimate goal was to recover the aging pew covers in the sanctuary in time for the 150th anniversary of the Church.

Raising funds usually needs a "gimmick" as an inspiration for giving. The Classy Cushion Committee was no exception. Members and friends could donate in the following categories: \$5 for a running foot; \$25 for a comfortable seat; \$50 for a family plan and a memorial gift. With an expected cost of \$5600, the project got off to a

There were 105 gifts received during the fundraising drive, so the project was declared a great success. The final piece the curved communion rail cushion which was completed as Rev. Alan Carvalho returned from vacation. What a wonderful surprise for the congregation to see the result of their gifts as the church prepared for its 150th anniversary in 1985.
